Jeremy Green, MD

Jeremy Green, MD, a board certified dermatologist, graduated Cum Laude with a Bachelor's degree from Princeton University. He completed his medical education at the Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine and the University of Miami Miller School of Medicine where he graduated with Alpha Omega Alpha (AOA) honors. Dr. Green trained at the University of Miami Department of Dermatology where he served s its Chief Resident. He completed advanced fellowship training in laser and cosmetic surgery at SkinCare Physicians in Boston, Massachusetts, with clinical faculty from the Harvard and Yale University Departments of Dermatology.

Dr. Green serves as a Voluntary Assistant Professor of Dermatology and Cutaneous Surgery at the University of Miami Department of Dermatology, where he provides patient care and resident education. He has published extensively and lectured both nationally and internationally on cosmetic dermatology and laser and light-based technologies. Dr. Green currently practices with Dr. Frederic S. Brandt of Dr. Brandt Dermatology Associates in Coral Gables, Florida.

Drusilla Hufford

Drusilla Hufford joined the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) in 1984 with an MBA from the Wharton School. Since joining EPA, she has worked on many environmental policy issues, including tracking and control of medical waste, hazardous waste characterization and management, and in EPA offices including the Office of Air And Radiation and the EPA Administrator's Policy Office.

Since 1992, Drusilla has worked to protect the stratospheric ozone layer, first as Chief of the Branch responsible for reliable development of the Significant New Alternatives Policy (SNAP) Program. SNAP has become an international model for alternatives approval, identifying and approving alternatives to ozone depleting substances (ODS) in major industrial sectors in over 400 applications. In 1997, Ms. Hufford was appointed Director of EPA's Stratospheric Protection Division. SPD implements Title VI of the Clean Air Act protecting the ozone layer; the division's work has resulted in large reductions in U.S. production and use of ODS, and is the mechanism for U.S. implementation of the international treaty to protect the ozone layer, the *Montreal Protocol on Substances that Deplete the Ozone Layer.*

Because ozone layer depletion increases ground-level UV radiation that can cause human health effects including skin cancer, Ms. Hufford has also developed public health campaigns to prevent skin cancer. In 1994, she helped establish the U.S. UV Index, now reported in all major U.S. media markets. In 1997, her work in skin cancer prevention developed a focus on protecting children's health, as she created the SunWise Program, a standards-based curriculum now used to teach sun safety to children at more than 28,000 schools K-8 in all U.S. states. From 2007-2010 she served as Co-Chair of the U.S. National Council on Skin Cancer Prevention.
